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Dear Parents

This letter includes important details regarding 6th form entry at Oryx International School. All offers for admission into Year 12 and agreement to study specific subjects at A level will be conditional and are based upon satisfactory I/GCSE (or equivalent) awards issued in August 2025.

Confirmation of general entry into Year 12 is subject to students' achieving a series of specific criterion. These are:

- A minimum of 5 I/GCSEs including Mathematics and English at Grade 5 or above
- A minimum of Grade 6 or above to study non-Science or Mathematics subjects (i.e. English, History, Geography, Design Technology, etc.) at A level
- A minimum of Grade 7 or above to study Chemistry, Physics, Biology or Mathematics at A level.

Parents of students who are not on track to achieve minimum entry requirements will be invited into school for a meeting with the Head of Secondary and the Head of Sixth Form.

Once I/GCSE results are confirmed in August 2025 there may be some recommended adaptation of courses to be followed due to an award being lower than expected.

In the event that any specific I/GCSE award does not meet the minimum threshold to study an A level course there will be reconsideration regarding the efficacy of following an A level course in that specific subject.

Careful consideration of subject choices should be made to ensure that students meet the requirements for further study at a higher level. The deadline for submission of course choices is 27 February. There will be a Year 11 Parent Teacher consultation on 14 April where parents, and students can discuss imminent I/GCSE examinations. Thereafter, official results will be released on 21 August.

It is a requirement of the MoEHE that all Arabic and Muslim students continue their study of Arabic and Islamic Studies until the end of Year 12. Arabic and Muslim students should choose 4 A levels on this form since provision is the same for all students.

In the event that I/GCSE awards do not meet thresholds mentioned above it may be that the student's course of study is either adapted or that the student is not recommended to follow a course of study involving A level at OIS.

To this end, all offers are conditional until I/GCSE outcomes are confirmed in August 2025 and individual consideration is given to each applicant to study A levels.
